Like most Americans, I have a sore spot about being "mandated" to do anything. But, in this case, I realized that the proposed solution is the very best appropriate approach to the larger problem. (The larger issue is the waste of energy and environmental impact - multiple trucks, multiple trips impacting the roads, multiple uses of fuel and pollution for each company to drive up and down the road to service clients.) I decided that, for the good of the town and the environment, I could rise above it, say goodbye to Bestway and embrace whichever company that steps up to it. The Manitou I know cares about the environment deeply, witness to the Fountain Creek Restoration Project. This event with the garbage service is another first... And reducing our town's environmental footprint is a wonderful way for us to continue progress to the future. Change is made in baby steps and this is a good step to take.
